A great choice for traditional spaces when paired with other warm tones


Pairs well with light to midtone woods

In south or west facing rooms it can look yellow escpecially in warm evening light


A warm white with a slight creamy undertone. Cloud White is a great choice if you are looking for a warm, slightly creamy white to pair with other warm tones for a cozy space.



For a seamless space, try painting walls, trim and ceilings in the same shade of white *but vary the sheen*.

For example, paint walls and ceilings in a matte finish but use a satin finish, which has more sheen, on the trim or cabinets

White walls can be difficult to keep clean, especially in busy households with pets or kids. For a washable finish *try an eggshell sheen* in a high quality paint which will be more durable over time





<u>Try a sample</u>. Light can have a huge effect on how we see color in a space. Before making a commitment paint a large sample on the wall or purchase *peel* & stick sheets from a company like Samplize. Observe at different times of day to make sure the shade works in your space.
